Jamie Jean Schneider is an experienced digital marketing professional with a proven record of building results-focused, integrated digital marketing strategies. Prior to joining the North American Division in 2016, she worked as digital marketing specialist for the Smithsonian Associates, the largest museum-based education program in the world. She was responsible for developing and implementing communications strategies for email and social media that led to explosive growth, contributing significantly to the organization becoming revenue-neutral for the first time in fifty years.

She was also the digital marketing manager of the Baltimore Symphony Orchestra. During her time managing its e-commerce strategy, the symphony received national recognition for its technological achievements. The BSO was voted as best orchestra in the metropolitan area by the *Washington City Paper*, which noted, "This is one tech-happy organization, and it pursues a Web strategy that a newspaper publisher or two could perhaps borrow from." The BSO also received the Orchestra Website Review Special Recognition Award in 2009 for its marketing innovations.




Dr. Medley has a rich and extensive background of over 25 years in ministry. His passion is to help people grow holistically toward Christian maturity.

Dr. Harvey Alférez is a professor at the School of Engineering and Technology, Universidad de Montemorelos, Mexico, where he leads the school's Global Software Lab. He holds a PhD in computer science (Summa Cum Laude) from Universitat Politècnica de València (Spain), an MSc in information and communication technology from Assumption University (Thailand), and a BSc in computer science engineering from Universidad EAFIT (Colombia).

His research interests include services computing, model-driven engineering, models at runtime, autonomic computing, data science, big data, and dynamic software product lines. He has contributed to publications in top scientific journals, written book chapters, and attended international conferences such as SPLC, ECOWS, MODELS, ICWS, IUPESM WCMPBME, ICAI, HIMS, and SERP (Scopus h-index: 6).

He has managed global enterprise software development projects and worked in universities, IT companies, and research groups in four continents (America, Asia, Australia, and Europe). He is also a member of the IEEE Monterrey Section and the IEEE Computer Society. He recently became a research fellow of Peru's National Council for Science, Technology, and Technological Innovation (CONCYTEC).

**Paul Hopkins**  
*Presenter*

Paul Hopkins is an accomplished executive with over a decade of philanthropic experience in the nonprofit sector, in addition to an extensive, proven track record of professional accomplishments as a fundraiser, strategic planner, organizational developer, manager, trainer, and consultant.

Under his watch as annual fund manager for the Adventist World Radio (AWR), donor acquisition costs dramatically dropped, and donor response to direct mail campaigns rose 20-60% above industry norms, producing roughly 80% of the AWR fundraising budget. The donor base also expanded by 22%, and the amount fundraised doubled, despite economic decline and reduced budget.

While serving as associate director for Philanthropic Service for Institutions (PSI), he helped shift executive perspectives of philanthropy into an institutional directive and empowered leadership with "Why?" as opposed to "How?" thinking. His website redesign allows clients to collaborate more closely and provides a rich multimedia platform that broadens the scope of what PSI can do, such as disseminating its training and resources in a cost-effective manner.

Paul is the director of Social Media + Big Data Services for the North American Division. His responsibilities include creating and overseeing a comprehensive plan to equip the Church in North America to utilize digital communication effectively, and educating denominational employees and members about the benefits of utilizing social media, as well as how to interpret analytic data. He is currently focusing on data visualization dashboards to make data analysis friendly, revealing amazing insights, and allowing interaction with data that supports strategic decision-making.
